MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON.

Today I conferred with Captain Jervey of the Small Arms Division, Ordnance Department, United States Army, relative to the requirement on the form attached to Division letter of May 4, 1934, that all Special Agents fire monthly sixty shots with the Colt Monitor Automatic Machine Rifle and sixty shots with the Thompson Submachine Gun.

Captain Jervey stated that in his opinion the requirement as to the number of shots to be fired monthly by each Special Agent with the Monitor and the Thompson guns is undesirable. It is believed that no good purpose is served by having each Agent fire one clip of cartridges from each gun, in full automatic fire. It is believed sufficient, after each Agent has become familiar with the operation of the gun and knows how to handle it, for him to fire one clip of twenty cartridges, ten shots to be semi-automatic fire; i.e., one shot at a time, and the remaining ten in short bursts.

It is, also, believed that the range at which the Colt Monitor is to be fired may be reduced from 200 to 100 yards as the real purpose of the monthly training is in order that Agents may receive practice in the handling of this arm and the practice may be had as satisfactorily at 100 yards as at 200 yards.

A reduction in the number of shots required monthly from each Agent would not only reduce an unnecessary expenditure for ammunition, but would avoid a too rapid wearing out of the guns which will be the result if the present requirement is continued in effect. The life of the gun barrel of a Colt

Monitor is estimated at about 7000 ro	unds, after which for accurate
